Tijania

A Sufi movement, which believes in usual Sufi ideas. In addition, Tijania believe that they have the exclusive ability to meet Muhammad (saaw), physically. They also believe that Muhammad (saaw) gave them a special prayer, which is exclusively for them. The prayer has the ability to solve all of their problems and make things easy.

Founder: Abu al-Abbas Ahmed bin Muhammad bin al-Mukhtar bin Ahmed bin Muhammad Salim Tijania.

Lived: 1737 AD to 1815 AD, in Algiers

Followers now live in Morocco, Sudan, Egypt, South Africa. There were reportedly 10 Million in Nigeria alone!

Qadiani

Established in the 1900's by the British in India to shift the Muslims away from the Deen of Islam, particularly negating the concept of Jihad. This was done so that no one would fight the Britain which was occupying India at the time. They believe that Allah is just like us, he sleeps, wakes, eats, drinks, etc. They also believe that God is English and he speaks English. Muhammad (saaw) is not considered to be the last messenger. Gibrael was sent to Ghulam Ahmed, the founder. They perform their Haj to Qadian, a town in India; they say that this city is better than Makkah and Madina. The followers are asked to give blind obedience to the Britians. They also believe that every Muslim is a Kafir, unless he becomes a Qadiani. They do not allow marriage to occur between a non-Qadiani and Qadiani. Alcohol is allowed.

Founder: Mirza Ghulam Ahmed, believed to be the Massaia. He was from a corrupt family which worked for the British. Ghulam Ahmed was a drug attic, moody and sick.

Lived: 1839 AD to 1908 AD

Followers now mostly live in India.

Bahai

They were also established by the imperialist powers; Russia and Britain with the help of the Jews in 1849. They were also established to drift Muslims away from the Islamic Aqeedah. They believe that the founder named as-Shiraz is the creator. Reward and punishment is for the soul only. They worship the number 19; they have 19 months in a year and days in a month are also 19. They believe in the prophethood of Buddha, Brahman, Confucius and others. They also agree with the Jews and Christians that Jesus was crucified. Women can not wear Hijab. Women are also considered community property so that any women can sleep with anyone. They also have the belief that Muhammad (saaw) was not the last prophet. Day of Judgment will not occur, until the founder returns to the Earth. Their Qibla is the house of founder's house. Their main office is in Israel.

Founder: Al-Maraz Alim Muhammad Ridda as-Shiraz, known as al-Bab. He died only 5 years after the establishment of the movement. Mirza Hussain Ali took over after him. He called himself Baha, hence the movement Bahai.

Lived: 1819 AD - 1849 AD.

Followers now live in Iran, Iraq, Syria, Lebanon and Palestine.
